



I'm passionate about movement. In Japanese, the word for move is 'Ugoku' and I've been fascinated by it since the early 2000's. When I moved from the States to Japan in 2016, I began exploring Ugoku Kanno (sensual movement). I combined elements from both Eastern and Western cultures to create a unique image of movement. My project explores how different cultures express themselves through movement and how they can be unified. The image I have created is an exploration of the intersection between East and West, looking at cultural influences from Japan's Edo period to Jackson Pollock and Henri Matisse. I wanted to showcase how these two cultures can be combined in a modern way that speaks to both sides.

In 2019, I began experimenting with images made in the form of Japanese hanging scrolls, (Kakejiku) which were traditionally shown vertically to display paintings and calligraphy.

For this piece, I photographed my subject over the course of several years. Through each photo taken, I was able to capture the subtleties of her movement and expressions. I combined these into a single Kakejiku frame that melded my subject's past, present and future together in one image.

I believe this is a modern interpretation of an ancient art form that speaks to the beauty of life and its journey through time. It has been an incredibly meaningful project for me, and I hope you will find it just as inspiring.





I remembered it right away because the first time I heard it was years earlier during a photo shoot with Quincy Jones. During the shoot, Quincy wanted to hear this song and I fell in love with it. The song was "In the Morning" on the A Rose is Still a Rose album and as the song played, everyone was lost in the song as Aretha's voice echoed through the studio.

Aretha and I had been trying to coordinate another shoot in 2017, but unfortunately, due to her declining health, we were never able to make it happen. In 2018, however, we spoke on the phone more than ever before and each time she'd tell me "Jordan, as soon as I'm strong enough, we'll shoot".

We all miss Aretha and all that she's done for us, but her spirit lives on through her music and art.



She would run over to the CD player and change the music, then run back on set. It was a great way to keep everyone energized and focused on the task at hand.

When it came time for the last image, I asked my subjects to close their eyes and hug - and that's how this image came to be! I just love how it captured their emotion in that moment.

With photographs, it's the real me looking into the camera and I feel like I have to pose." For this image, I called out the name of the Quentin Tarantino film, Pulp Fiction where his character says, "my wallet is the one that has Bad M... 


Photographer Matthew Jordan Smith

Photographer, Matthew Jordan Smith is known for creating iconic photographs. He has worked with some of today's biggest names in entertainment, fashion/beauty, and pop culture. Zendaya to Carlos Slim, Michael Jordan to the President of Iceland, and recently, Filippo Grandi, the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees.

He is the recipient of numerous awards and honors, including the Western Digital Spotlight award in 2022, the Microsoft Icons of Imaging award, the WPPI Vision Award, and the George Eastman Power of Image award. To date, he has published three books. His first book, *Sepia Dreams*, includes images and stories of 50 celebrities as they share their journey of turning dreams into reality. In his last book, *Future American President*, Smith traveled to every state in American to photograph 100 children.

In 2021, the *International Olympic Committee* commissioned him to document life in the Olympic Village during a global pandemic, making him the first photographer in history to live in the village during the games. Only two other photographers have documented life in the Olympic Village (in 1936 and in 1999) but none lived in the village alongside the athletes.

A native of Brooklyn, New York, Matthew resides in Tokyo, Japan.
